

## Our Beginning

In 1982, Jackie Bosby (Hill at that time) developed a program called the E-4 Below Referral Service. This program was founded and developed in Misawa, Japan. Jackie implemented and supervised the entire program for 16 months alone. Services and programs were provided to the young Military families that faced cultural shock from being in a new Country. In 1994, Jackie had orders to return to the States, so she asked 4 families to share the burden and run the program., after she moved back to the States and the program was abolished by the individuals she left handling it.

Jackie came back to Illinois with a plan to help the Military families but as she walked the streets of downtown Chicago she realized there was a bigger need. The homeless. Jackie went back and started researching, contacting every Shelter and visiting everyone that would allow her to come in. Jackie worked with 9 different shelters from 1984-1988. The Express H.O.M.E. Program started out as a full service provider for the homeless in Chicago, Illinois.

In 1989, she opened her own homeless shelter, and in 1992, married Michael Bosby and revamped the program to only house runaways and thrown away teens. By 1999 Jackie and her husband Mike had documents to show they had helped and housed over 300 teens. Services ranged from 1 day to 3 years and beyond.

Michael and Jacqueline joined forces in 1990 to help the homeless, Jackie developed all of the programs and Mike raised all of the money through a variety of talent showcases.

In 1992, Michael and Jacqueline got married and they continued providing services and programs to the homeless and low-income families.

In 1994, the newly elected Mayor offered Jackie the job as Community Relations Director for the Village of Maywood, Illinois. This would allow her to continue to do all of her programs for the entire community with a meek budget. In 1996 she took the job and in 1998 when the new Mayor came in she went back to only working with the homeless and the children that were coming in and out of her own home.

The Bosby's re-located their family and businesses to Georgia in June or 2000; where they continue to implement educational programs with their children. This is done through TV, Print, Seminars, Classes, Workshops and Expositions. In 2002, Jackie developed a unique leadership program that she implements throughout Northeast and South Georgia.
